ADOS Assessment

The Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule (ADOS) is an instrument used as part of a multi-disciplinary diagnosis and assessment of autism.

The protocol consists of a series of structured and semi-structured tasks that involve social interaction between the examiner and the person under assessment. The examiner observes and identifies segments of the person's behaviour and assigns these to predetermined observational categories.

Categorised observations are subsequently combined to produce quantitative scores for analysis. Research determined cut-offs identify the potential diagnosis of classic autistic disorder, allowing a standardised assessment of autistic symptoms.

As an independent practitioner, we can't diagnose autism. The ADOS can be used to aid further understanding of a child and help support the need for further assessment. It can be used as part of a multi-disciplinary specialist assessment.
