## QbCheck Assessment: Measures the three core symptoms of ADHD; activity, inattention and impulsivity

Computer based assessment that it used to measure the person's ability to pay attention, and activity level over time.

The person is sat in front of the computer and has to press the space bar to identify an object or repeated object- so its a simple computer task. A inbuilt camera in the computer will track movement but does not record.

Full instructions and test practice is provided, prior to the test

A report is generated at the end of the assessment that the therapist will review. The Obcheck results can help find out why the person may be having difficulties in concentrating, feeling fidgety or having too much energy at night. It will also help indicate the likelihood of ADHD symptom, in comparison to other people their age and gender with and without ADHD.

The results of the Qbcheck can then help determine the type of support the person may need.

Aligns with the indicators on the DSM-5

The actual test takes between 15-20 minutes

Suitable for ages 6+ to adult

Can also be used as part of a ADHD assessment or as a screening tool to help identify support required.
